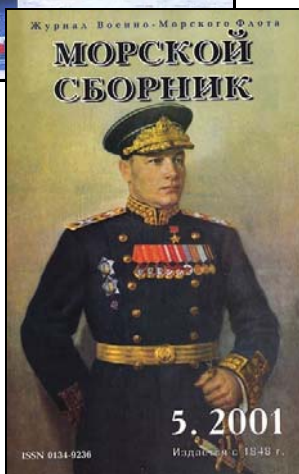
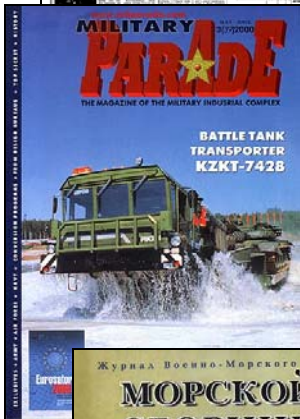


UDB-MIL Russian Military & Security Publications Online

Coverage

UDB-MIL consists of 55 titles encompassing independent and official military and security texts, journals, and regional military district papers, many of which are available only from East View.

The database provides access to a broad range of Russian military texts, including central military journals and regional military district newspapers in all major strategic areas. All branches of the armed forces are covered, including the Russian Air Force, Army and Navy. In addition to journals and newspapers published in Moscow, the database presents imprints from military districts and some armies and divisions.

[Were Russian diplomats kidnapped by Iranians?]

<> "THE IRANIAN TRACE" OF ABDUCTION OF RUSSIAN DIPLOMATS IN BAGHDAD. TEHRAN IS TELLING RUSSIA THAT A COUNTRY OUGHT TO STICK TO ITS POLITICAL LINE

A friend of mine, an Arab journalist who peeces that regularly appear in newspapers of Middle East countries, visited Iran not long ago where he met with several senior officials of the government and prominent parliamentarians in Baghdad.

"Most of them chose to talk Farsi (the principal language in Iran - Pravda). Interesting, isn't it?" he said. "Everybody in Baghdad knows that once the Americans went home - and they will inevitably withdraw inside of two years - Iran as the most powerful state in the region will take their place in Iraq."

Iran has some major acer in its hand in the confrontation with the Americans over its **nuclear** program. Some observer even coined the term "Middle East Stalingrad". This is what the matter comes down to: the United States lashes at Iran and Tehran retaliates by blocking the Persian Gulf. (A major tanker or two sunk at the mouth, and that is that. Small as it is, the Iranian submarine fleet is quite adequate for the mission.) It will cut the supply routes of the American and British groups in Iraq. **Airlift** - the only way out for the counter-terrorism coalition - will be vulnerable before Iranian antiaircraft defense means. Once the airlift is ravaged, the Iranian army with its neighbors will make mincemeat of the Americans and British - hence the reference to Stalingrad.



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
